CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

There is little doubt that these are interesting times in New Zealand brewing with arguably the most significant changes to New Zealand brewing industry occurring in our time. Over recent years, microbrewery numbers have significantly expanded, while at the same time larger breweries have become increasingly interested in expanding their range. Both these trends have resulted in an explosion of beer styles and brands that are now available to the New Zealand consumer.

For us as brewers, the challenges to the future of our industry will be to protect the brand that is New Zealand beer - develop and accentuate the factors that make New Zealand beer unique and desirable, protect its value and position in the market and, at the same time, stay true to our social responsibility.

In recent years, we have made a start in that process with the advent of the Brewers Guild of New Zealand (BGNZ), an organisation of brewers that can act as a collective voice for all the industry. The Guild's strength is that it has brought together representatives from the majority of the brewing industry in one single organisation – the first time this has occurred in the history of New Zealand brewing. The BGNZ needs to continue to develop and evolve to maintain significance to its members. Part of that continued evolution this year has been an updating of the Guild's mission statement; simplifying and modernising our aims and mission for future years.

The BGNZ this year

The Guild Committee continued this year to act as a communication hub and contact point for enquiries regarding the brewing industry in New Zealand. This has allowed collective views of the industry to be heard and broadcast without prejudice or bias. There were multiple cases this year where the Guild Executive was called upon to make comments to media – a good sign that the Guild is now becoming recognised as a collective voice for the industry. Helping our communication has been the re-launch of the BGNZ website, making it more user-friendly.

We also saw the continuation of the Craft Beer Industry Survey. The collection of data year on year is starting to produce a compelling story of the changing structure of the beer market in New Zealand. Results show that the craft beer market continues to expand both in the number of breweries and the volume that those small brewers produce, suggesting that the public are changing their drinking habits. It is very encouraging also to see that most brewers consider that they will grow in size and look to be exporting in the next year.

The Guild committee worked hard on streamlining and bedding-in the success of the BGNZ Beer Awards as a standalone and financially self-sustaining event. This has allowed the Guild to focus on the core business of recognising and promoting excellence in the brewing industry through the awards and leaving the business (and risk) of beer festivals to those who have the skills and ability to make those events successful.

The benefits of a stable and maturing Guild have started to materialise this year with several exciting developments:

- We supported **Craft Beer TV** with financial grant to help with the final editing stages of this very successful project that has helped raise the profile of brewing in New Zealand.
- The Guild launched the **BGNZ Development Fund**. The fund will allow the Guild to finance projects that it sees benefit the large majority of Guild members
- We also launched the BGNZ benevolent fund financed through the remainder of last year's donations from the brewing fraternity to aid Canterbury brewers affected by the earthquakes of 2011
- The **Morton Coutts Award** criteria were extended to include not only innovation but also longterm contribution to the brewing industry in any form, allowing us more opportunity to recognise key figures in our industry
- Adding to the recognition of those who contribute to the brewing industry in New Zealand, the Guild this year has initiated the **BGNZ Beer Writer of the Yea**r award. This annual award will recognise the most significant contribution in the media and is designed to recognise and encourage media contribution to our industry.



Executive Projects

Along with the day-to-day running of the BGNZ, committee members have been busy contributing with more individually-driven projects. Some of these projects are incredibly time-consuming for Committee members and they deserve much credit for their input. These projects include:

- (a) The development of the NZQA recognised *Certificate in Craft Beer*. This is New Zealand's only industry-backed, nationally recognised qualification in this field. This is an important step into education and training
- (b) A significant submission on Labelling Logic Review of Food Labelling Law and Policy
- (c) Initiation of a "Keg Repatriation" initiative. Making sure some long-lost property is returned to rightful owners
- (d) A review of the fees structure for the Guild that simplifies membership categories based on production volume. The new system will mean that Guild membership fees better match the size of brewery based on production
- (e) A refinement of entry categories and classes for the BGNZ Beer Awards
- (f) An investigation into the possible appointment of a paid, part-time position to help with the day-to-day running of the Guild, allowing the Committee to put more time and energy into projects that benefit all Guild members.

This year we will be losing from the Guild Committee Sam Williamson, Søren Eriksen and Darryl Sweeney. A big thank you for their contribution to the BGNZ. Another heart-felt thanks to Frances and Ted Verrity for their constant efforts on behalf of the Guild. I'm sure we all wish both Frances and Ted the very best results with Ted's recovery in the year ahead.

As I complete one year as President of the BGNZ, I can honestly say that I am constantly amazed at the passion and commitment that committee members have for the BGNZ and the brewing industry in general. All the committee members undertake their roles at a significant cost to their own time and businesses. If you get a chance, shout them a beer and say a small thanks of your own!

Tonight's Awards

This year we topped 450 plus entries in the Sutton Group BGNZ Beer Awards – a reflection of how the event is held in high regard both nationally and internationally. Head judge for the second year is Brian Watson bringing again his 20 plus years of experience as a brewer and beer judge at the international level.

This year for our awards ceremony we welcome Te Radar as our Master of Ceremonies. Te Radar is our very own NZ media celebrity who will no doubt bring his usual and unusual take on proceedings.
